Trustworthiness of the Bible

- Where do we start?
- What are the skeptic's questions?
  - Is it all a matter of interpretation?
    - Is all that is written a matter of the "listener's" (analysis, explanation, version)
    - Why are there so many sects i.e. denominations from one bible?
  - How do we know what was written, was written correctly?
  - Even it was written correctly, how do we know it's true?
  - How do account for all the miracles?
  - What about all the contradictions?

- What about all the other "holy" books?
- Is there any concrete, historical proof of the events written?
- How about Noah's Ark? Jonah's fish? Red sea parting?
  Darkness for three hours after Jesus' death?
- Do you actually believe in miracles?
- What about all the killing in the Old Testament commanded by God?
- Does the Bible endorse slavery?
- Isn't the Bible sexist?
- Is the Bible out of date on sex and marriage?
- What about the "Canon" Can it be trusted as legitimate? Man deciding or God inspired?

Language and meaning

- The argument that texts and words only have the meaning that the listener or reader gives them fails **its own test.**
- Language as power
  - Michel Foucault— To try to assert meaning using words is to try to take <u>power</u> over someone else's life.
  - In the process of telling us that to assert meaning is <u>to</u> <u>take power</u>, over someone, (according to his own logic) attempts to <u>take power</u> over his readers.
  - These ideas are <u>logically incoherent</u> and inconsistent.
